I would like to thank the Board of Directors and the delegates of re-electing me for another two year term as President of the Maine State Federation of Fire Fighters Inc.

As myself and the Board of Directors, we would like to thank the Bath Fire Department and the City of Bath for hosting a very successful convention.

The American Income Life have changed from \$1000.00 to \$2000.00, and also 1/2 for dismemberment. also deleated the benefits for spouse and dependents. These changes are effective October 2, 2004.

The Federation benefits have been increased from \$300.00 to \$500.00 for all deaths. We have dropped the \$5000.00 line of duty death benefit. We decided that with the consent of the membership, now that the Federal Government have over \$250,000.00 and the State has \$50,000.00 for all firefighters who die in the line of duty.

The top 3 places for the Dry Hose event were as follows: First place went to Acton with a time of 22.43, second place went to Lakes Region 2 with a time of 22.76 and third went to Kittery. Their time was 23.66.

Second place went to Madison, with a time of 2.37.09. The third place team was Kezar Falls with a time of 2.40.50.

The Eugene Temple overall Muster winner was a tie between Madison and Lakes Region 2. The winner with the lowest elapsed time was Madison. The Anson Fire Department won the Bobbie Wallingford Muster Sportsmanship award.

The Erwin Faunce Award for overall sportsmanship and participation in the whole convention was won by the team from Sanford.

A I L INSURANCE

Dave Provencher from American Income Life Insurance Company met with the Board at our meeting in October. He told us that AIL's claim history showed that they pay about 97.5% of all claims to Federation members and that they pay only about 2.5% of the benefits to dependents. He suggested that if the

Federation wanted to eliminate dependent benefits that AIL could double the benefits to members. Dave said that the amendment would also double dismemberment benefits. The Board voted to pass the amendment. Now your accidental death and dismemberment policy is worth \$2000.00. Remember that this policy is given to the members of the Federation at no cost to you or to the Federation. If you would like more information on the AIL insurance contact your county vice-president.

FIREFIGHTER OF THE YEAR

The Federation Firefighter of the Year Award this year went to Clarence W. Conway of the Vinalhaven Fire Department. 
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
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NVFC PRELIMINARY LOSAP PLAN PROVISIONS

- 1.) IR S Code Section 457 To avoid being considered by the IRS as employees of the Service Award Program sponsor and not have amounts into a Service Award Program by the sponsor considered as current W-2 compensation for vested participants: A volunteer must be a "bona fide" volunteer, and, The Service Award paid to the volunteer for any one year of service cannot exceed \$3,000.
- 2.) Defined Benefit vs.
 Defined Contribution
 Defined Contribution allows for: Flexible funding level,
 Multiple funding sources,
 Future expansion for cafeteria type benefits.
 3) Who is eligible: Bona fide
- volunteer (IRC 457). As the IRS hasn't defined what a Bona fide volunteer is, we'll leave this definition open as well. We need to ask the IRS to define this./Meets minimum activity requirements as set by local fire departments consist with NVFC published guidelines.

 a) Eligible after one year of active service? Once eligible a volunteer becomes a

participant as of Dec. 31 of

the year he became eligible.

4) Prior Service Credit a)
Counts toward vesting.
Can be funded at the
option of the local
Municipality.

5) Vesting Schedule: a) 33% year 3, 67% year 5, 100% year 7

- 6). Forfeitures: For firefighters with account balances, quit, and are not vested. a) Local contributions reallocated to remaining active members of local Fire Dept, national contributions credited back to reduce future cost.
- 7). Portability: Firefighter account balances may be transferred from one municipality to another.
- 8). Payout occurs for:
 a)Retirement: After 20
 years of service or age 60.
 Can be deferred to
 continue accruing benefits.
- b) Death c) Total and permanent disability.
- 9). Payout Options: a) Lump sum. b) 5 Year payout. c) 10 Year payout. d) All of the above.
- 10). Plan Year: a) Calendar year.
- 11). Firefighter active list deadlines: February 1
- 12). Sponsor contribution deadlines: March 1
- 13). LEAVE OF ABSENCE Length of leave open to local Municipality. Vesting frozen as of leave date. No

contribution made during leave.

14). MILITARY LEAVE
No contribution made. Time
adds to vesting. No
contribution is made.
15). Termination of nonvested participant after
second year of inactivity.
16). Goal of providing
NVFC with an annual budget
of \$2 million: a) Paid by plan
participants through
membership dues. and/or b)
Paid by an asset-based fee.
